## **Bankruptcy Case Records & Credit Reporting**

Bankruptcy filings are public records open to examination by law with few exceptions. See <u>11 U.S.C. § 107</u>; Fed. R. Bankr. P. 5003, 9037. The bankruptcy court does not report or provide information to any consumer reporting agencies. Moreover, the bankruptcy court is not responsible for verifying or validating information contained in consumers' credit reports.

To view bankruptcy case records:

- Visit a clerk's office location. <u>Use Federal Court Finder to find a location</u>. Public access computers are available for use, at no charge, in the Clerk's Office of the Arizona Bankruptcy Court.
  Bankruptcy documents may be viewed in person or retrieved for printing or copying. Printing and copying fees apply.
- Search online through <u>Public Access to Court Electronic</u>
  <u>Records (PACER)</u>. You will need to sign up for a PACER account to search for and view records online.
