GENERAL ORDER NO. 62

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, effective immediately,

)

1. The only personnel permitted to carry firearms or weapons in the courtrooms, offices and space in the Phoenix Bankruptcy Court are the United States Marshals or Court Security Officers. Any deviations from this Order must first receive the prior approval of the United States Marshal with prior notice to the Chief Bankruptcy Judge.

2. All forms, means and manner of taking photographs, making video or audio recordings or broadcasts, or making or receiving transmissions by portable telephone, pager or two-way radio are prohibited in all courtrooms and office space controlled by the Phoenix Bankruptcy Court, whether the Court is actually in session or not. However, there are two exceptions to this provision.

(a) First, this General Order does not prohibit recordings by an official court reporter designed by the Court to make the official Court record; and

(b) Second, with the prior permission of the Court in a particular case or proceeding, counsel may bring into Court an unobtrusive hand-held dictating machine for dictating notes during a hearing. It is not to be used to record any part of the hearing.
