PUBLIC NOTICE

RE: BANKRUPTCY NOTICING CENTER PROCEDURES

In our efforts to align the Court's BNC noticing procedures with the BNC Appropriate Use Policy established by the Administrative Office and to ensure fiscal oversight and cost-efficiency, certain CM/ECF docket events will no longer be available for noticing. The court will notice bankruptcy case-related documents that are the court's responsibility to notice as required by the Federal and Local Rules.

Effective October 21, 2024, CM/ECF Trustee docket events that previously provided BNC notice by the Court will be discontinued. These events may include but not be limited to:

- Motions (e.g., motions to dismiss or convert the case)
- Objections (e.g., objection to claim or objection to confirmation)
- Certain Notices (e.g., trustee's notice of proposed abandonment of property)

This change may primarily impact Trustees and their counsel who have previously utilized CM/ECF to notice these documents the past.

The Court will continue to monitor its noticing procedures and the use of BNC to ensure compliance with regulatory requirements and maintain cost-effectiveness.
